Governor opens schools and intentional safety protocols are put in place to ensure the health and safety of students and staff

Governor orders that all schools cease on-campus instruction

Modifications to Normal School Life

- Grandparents Day has been suspended for the 2020-2021 school year, and the school calendar has been adjusted to take the entire week off at Thanksgiving. The latest data indicates that persons infected with COVID-19 shed the virus for nine days. This calendar modification will provide a nine day break for everyone in late November.
- Large Group Gatherings:
 - Chapel will be held in the classroom, gym, in small groups/class meetings, or outside with appropriate social distancing among the grades
 - The number of students in the cafeteria will be reduced by having a rotation of classes that eat in their classroom
 - Self-serve items typically in the cafeteria (i.e. salad bar) will be removed and pre-packaged
 - There will be no gathering of families in the gym at elementary parent orientation. Mrs. Johnson will pre-record her remarks, which will be provided to all families. Parents and students will still have the opportunity to come up to meet their teachers and see their classroom, but this will be done in waves (more info to come) as to allow for social distancing.
 - Only sixth grade families and those of new students will attend secondary parent orientation. Mr. Gravitt's remarks will be streamed live and then archived for those unable to watch at the time. Returning students will be allotted time before school to come pick up their schedule (and make changes if necessary) and organize their locker.
 - Recess time will be staggered so as to allow each grade access to the playground by themselves.
 - Pep Rallies will be held outside in the quad this year.

Preventative Measures to Protect Students and Staff

- Enhanced cleaning measures will be taken by our housekeeping staff in the evenings and faculty/staff members throughout the school day.
- Hand sanitizer will be available in all classrooms and common areas.
- PPE will not be mandated for students or staff.
- Disposable masks will be provided for those students that would like them.
- Disposable gloves will be provided for those students that would like them.
- Parents and other visitors on campus after drop-off will be strongly discouraged as we attempt to limit exposure.

SCREENING PROTOCOL:

- Faculty/staff will self-assess each morning.
- All students will have their temperature taken at the point of first contact on campus. This includes early morning arrival and first period classes for secondary students. Elementary teachers will open their doors at 8:00 this year and check students as they come in the door.
- Students that are tardy to school will have their temperature taken by building administrative assistants, which will be noted on their admittance slip to class.
- A fever will be defined as a temperature of 100.4 or greater (this is consistent with the CDC definition of a fever).

Preventative Measures to Protect Students and Staff (continued)

STUDENT TEMPERATURE IS 100.4 OR HIGHER

- Student will be immediately referred to school nurse where an assessment will be performed, and the temperature will be taken again after a 10 minute waiting period. If less than 100.4, student will be sent back to class and monitored throughout the day.
- Student will be sent home after second confirmed reading.
- Students that test positive for COVID-19 must notify the school and follow the prescribed "Return to School" protocol.*
- Students that test negative for COVID-19 may return with a note from their physician.
- Students that test positive for flu, strep throat, etc., may return with a note from their physician.
- Students that elect not to see a physician will be assumed positive and must follow the prescribed "Return to School" protocol.*
- Administration will alert families of a classmate that has tested positive for COVID-19. Attendance standards will be relaxed for those
 families that choose to keep their child at home for the recommended quarantine period. Work will be sent home as if they were absent
 due to illness and expected upon their return.

At least 3 days (72 hours) have passed since recovery defined as resolution of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications and improvement in respiratory symptoms (e.g., cough, shortness of breath): and, at least 10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared

^{*}Return to School Protocol will be the latest recommendations by the CDC at the time. Protocol at the release of this document is as follows:

Extra-Curricular Activities and Update

- Athletic offerings will adhere to recommendations and requirements set forth by the Texas Association of Private and Parochial Schools (TAPPS).
- Field trips will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
- Decisions on concerts, programs, and events such as the Lone Star Legacy and Medieval Fair will be made as soon as feasible.
- Student travel with appropriate social distancing is being examined at this time.
